WAUKESHA COUNTY IMPACT

In 2015, United Way of Greater Milwaukee and United Way in Waukesha County joined together to form United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County to better serve our shared community. Since the merger, we have been used a variety of strategies to fight for the health, education, and financial stability of everyone in Waukesha County.

WAUKESHA COMMUNITY IMPACT FUND

Established in 2015, this fund supports programs that impact the issues most important to the Waukesha County community. Ten new grants have been made from this fund to date, a few of which are described below:

Improving Culturally-responsive Peer Support for the Breast Cancer Journey - Latina Initiative

After Breast Cancer Diagnosis (ABCD)

United Way funding has allowed ABCD to expand their one-on-one support program for those experiencing breast cancer in Waukesha County's Spanish-speaking community. Additionally, this funding supports ABCD's efforts to address disparities in access to care and deliver information on survivorship and breast health education in a comprehensive, culturally-sensitive way.

Waukesha Literacy Project

SHARP Literacy

United Way supported the expansion of SHARP Literacy to Waukesha County, impacting over 600 students at three schools. SHARP's curriculum and materials, available in both English and Spanish, are based on research and motivate children to identify themselves as confident, capable scholars. The SHARP strategy promotes lifelong learning by inspiring engagement in reading, writing, and research through hands-on interaction and visual arts. This pilot program currently serves K4 through 3rd graders, but we anticipate expanding to more grades in the future.

Housing Action Coalition of Waukesha County

The mission of the Housing Action Coalition is to educate, advocate, and raise awareness while providing a cohesive and coordinated response to homelessness and the issues related to it in Waukesha County.

United Way serves on the executive committee, board of directors, and the coordinated entry committee and also supports winter overflow shelters with funding and supplies.





INITIATIVES WE LEAD

NEW Opiate Abuse Prevention & Treatment Initiative - Waukesha County

United Way invests in the prevention and treatment of opioid abuse. A growing public health concern in Wisconsin, opioid abuse contributes to a steadily increasing number of unintentional deaths each year. In Wisconsin, there were more than seven times as many opioid-related deaths in 2016 as in 2000.

In 2018, United Way made a grant to Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers to offset the costs of providing alcohol and other drug abuse counseling to under- and un-insured residents of Waukesha County.

Additionally, United Way hosted a series of trainings on Narcan, the life-saving drug that reverses opioid overdoses, to more than 50 staff from Waukesha County partner agencies. Attendees were trained on how to identify an opiate overdose, how to safely administer Narcan, and were given Narcan treatment kits.

Helping Kids Succeed

United Way supports programs at GPS Education Partners, Wisconsin Community Services, and the School District of Waukesha to support students at local, high-need schools. The goals for Helping Kids Succeed include supporting educators, increasing student achievement, enhancing family stability and empowerment, and improving community engagement.

Asset Building

When people cannot meet their basic needs, the entire community is affected. United Way focuses on funding programs that teach families and individuals the skills they need to increase income, build savings, and achieve financial independence. We support the Financial Stability program at La Casa de Esperanza, which helps Waukesha County families become stable and successful.

NEW Build My Bookshelf

United Way's Build My Bookshelf literacy program puts books into the hands of Waukesha students. Throughout the school year, participating high-need schools host book fairs where volunteers help students choose three brand new, free books to build their own home libraries. Nearly 18,000 books have been given to students at participating Waukesha schools in the last two years.

Community Conversations

In 2017, United Way hosted four Community Conversations with diverse groups in Waukesha County. Thirty four participants shared their concerns and aspirations for their community, including safety, diversity, the need for more positive interactions between neighbors, and overall community connectedness. United Way also provided support for the "Conversations Count" effort at Brookfield East High School, which aims to promote conversation and problem-solving around racial disparities in the school and district. It's a model we will expand to support other schools and districts seeking to build inclusion with their families and staff.

ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

Backpack Coalition - Waukesha & Milwaukee

United Way's Backpack Coalition is committed to providing backpacks and school supplies to students with financial constraints. In 2017, 250 volunteers, filled 2,331 backpacks for Waukesha County students and 2,585 backpacks for Milwaukee County students for a total of 4,916 backpacks valued at \$369,750.

NEW Financial Empowerment Seminar

United Way and La Casa de Esperanza organized a financial empowerment seminar as part of the national Money Smart Week, open to the public in downtown Waukesha. One-on-one financial coaches helped families access and understand their FICO® Score Summary, learn about financial resources, develop monthly budget plans, and organize statements and bills.

Thriving Waukesha County Alliance

United Way celebrated its sixth year of supporting Thriving Waukesha to increase collaboration among non-profit partners and mobilize resources for all Waukesha County residents. In 2017-18 United Way continued to support this effort through dedicated staff time and an investment of nearly \$25,000.

Whittier Elementary Field Day

For the past two years, Whittier Elementary in Waukesha has hosted United Way volunteers for Field Day. Field Day consists of multiple stations intended to help students better understand the importance of being active and staying healthy.

NEW Waukesha Summer Meals

For some families, free school lunches are the only time their children are guaranteed a daily meal. United Way provides financial and volunteer support to serve about 3,000 meals to low-income families in Waukesha during the summer break at Banting Park. Recreation equipment is provided for children, and wraparound support resources are provided for parents.

Women's Job Seminar

In 2017, United Way hosted the second annual Ready, Set, Work! Women's Job Seminar in Waukesha, sponsored by BMO Harris Bank. More than thirty-five local women facing barriers to employment were matched one-on-one with resume, interview, and basic budgeting coaches to sharpen their skills. Participants left ready to embark on the next part of their personal and professional journey.
